1.Maths

Operation Maths. If at all possible for you, we feel it would be good for the children to continue with their current Maths Book. The relevant pages can be accessed through edco. Below you will also see some guidelines as to how best to approach helping your child with each page, each day.

- Search for <u>www.edcolearning.ie</u>
- Click login (green button)
- The username is primaryedcobooks and password is edco2020 (all lower case no spaces)
- · Click log in
- On the top left-hand corner in the white box search for 'Operation Maths'
- Scroll down to the bottom of the page to find the senior infant book
- Click on the book
- Then click body of the book, using the arrows to move forwards and backwards to find the page
- Complete pages 88-92 (schoolbook) See Timetable. We suggest that the children copy down where possible into a copybook

Here are some helpful tips for each page

Page 88 Operation Maths:

Part A: What toys can you see? Ask to count how many of each toy they can see. Ask questions eg How many robots are there? How many more robots are there than horses?

Part B: Read the questions. Give time to respond.

Page 89

Point to the 1st set of hands. How many are painted with orange? How many with blue? How many fingers altogether? Write the corresponding sum: 10+0 =10

Page 90

Part A: In place of counters, cut up 10 pieces of card/use raisins etc and place on either side of the rugby ball. How many different ways can you make 10? Write the corresponding sum.

Part B: Ask: What number comes before 5? After 7?

<u>Page 91:</u>

Point to the first box. What numeral is missing?

• Tables Challenge. The attached worksheet should be completed on a daily basis. If you have access to a printer - great! Otherwise just write them out in a copy or on a page. See how fast you can go!! Maybe time it?

2 ENGLISH

- Finish reading 'Globby Helps Out' and re-read from the beginning as per Timetable.
- Continue with Dolch lists.
- Spellings Week 10 (If your child brought home their folder, they will have a hard copy of this, if not see timetable)
- Any extra reading that you have access to will be hugely beneficial.
- Writing. We suggest a minimum of two sentences in a copy for NEWS. Not necessarily every day but 3 days over the week would be important. Draw a picture with it.

3 GAEILGE

It is important that the children continue to practise speaking Irish even just for a few minutes every day. They are very good in class and most should be well able to continue to practise the following *Cómhrá (Conversation)* every day - with you, an older sibling or with doll/puppets.

Dia duit. Dia is Muire duit. (Hello,,)

Cé tusa? (Who are you?) Is mise....(I am ...)

Conas atá tú? (How are you?) Tá mé go maith, go raibh maith agat. Conas atá tú? (I am well,thank you. How are you?) Cén saghas lae é? (What kind of day is it?) Tá an lá fuar/te/griannmhar/fluich/tirim/gaofar/scamallach. (The day is cold/hot/sunny/wet/dry/windy/cloudy)

Encouraging saying please and thank you, you're welcome which they are very good at (Más é do thoil é, Go raibh maith agat. Tá fáilte romhat). Also practising their colours by pointing at an object and saying EG Tá an geansaí gorm (The jumper is blue)

We were concentrating on the theme Sa Bhaile (At home) during March. The children were becoming quite familiar with the different rooms in the house, as Gaeilge. Attached is a page that could be printed off or drawn (a simple version!!!), by an adult or older child, if not by herself. Alternatively, if you have a doll's house, this game could be played also: Move a small toy doll from room to room, asking Cá bhfuil Teidí/Dolly? (Where is....?) Tá ... sa chistin/seomra suí etc (T is in the kitchen/sitting room etc)

4. Religion

(Only complete if your child takes part in the **Grow in Love** programme in school)

- Search for www.growinlove.ie
- Click login (orange button)
- The email address is trial@growinlove.ie and the password is growinlove (all lowercase no spaces)
- Click login (orange button)
- Then click the Senior Infant book
- Then click 7. Holy Week and Easter
- There are three lessons to be covered in this theme: The last supper, Jesus dies on the cross and Jesus is alive. In each lesson there are various videos, stories etc that the children can engage with.
- On the right-hand side of the website you can access the children's workbook. The pages that are linked with the above lessons are pages 42-47. (Use the arrows to navigate through the pages of the book.

5.SESE (History, Geography and Science)

- Search for www.cjfallon.ie
- You will see a yellow banner with blue writing saying important notice
- At the bottom of the yellow banner click on the blue button click here
- In the 2nd column under class select **Senior Infants**
- In the 3rd column under subject select SESE
- In the 4th column under series select Small World
- At the bottom of the screen underneath Actions click on the eye symbol
- You will then be asked to input your name, email address and select parent.
- Then click the blue button open book
- Use the arrows to navigate through the pages
- Complete pages 36+ 37 March Walkabout
